

CROATIAN ISLANDS LUXURY CRUISE

Cruising aboard the beautiful 38-passenger Futura or another similar vessel is a glorious way to discover these picturesque islands, charming cities and hidden gems of Croatia on this relaxing cruise from the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Split. Diocletian's Palace in Split should have been one of the ancient wonders of the world and still to this day dominates life in central Split; explore this fantastic city before setting sail for the idyllic island of Korcula, best known as the birthplace of Marco Polo. Enjoy dinner at one of the excellent restaurants on the island. Your deluxe ship heads further south to the island of Mljet. See the famous salt lakes in Mljet National Park or explore independently, before heading to the historic city of Dubrovnik where you can enjoy a cable car ride from the Old Town to Srd mountain for breathtaking views of the city walls and Elaphiti Islands. Explore Hvar which is known for its lavender fields and stunning scenery and visit the fisherman's town of Bol, before heading back to Split.



ITINERARY

Day 1: SPLIT (D)

Transfer from the Split airport to the Split harbour where the vessel will be docked. Check-in from 14.00 h onwards. After settling, enjoy the guided tour of the city at 17.00h (not possible for late arrivals). Split is a historic town under UNESCO



protection and part of the world heritage. One will find an abundance of Roman architecture - of special interest is the magnificent Diocletian palace, once inhabited by the Roman emperor. After the tour of Split, return to the vessel for a welcome reception and cocktail. Enjoy the meet-and-greet party on board. Overnight in Split.

Day 2: SPLIT - KOR ULA (B, L)

In the morning, a departure from this magnificent town and cruise towards the Island of Kor ula, best known as the birthplace of Marco Polo. Stop for lunch in one of the secluded bays en route. Early afternoon arrival in Kor ula followed by a guided walking tour of the enchanting town fortified by walls. Kor ula treasures more legends, tales and monuments than any other place, discover some wandering along the herringbone pattern streets. Kor ula has an abundant choice of restaurants for a great gourmet experience and there are many bars and clubs for those looking for evening entertainment. Overnight in Kor ula

Day 3: KOR ULA - MLJET & DUBROVNIK (B, L, D)

The next morning, head further south to the Island of Mljet. Join the cruise manager for a stroll to the famous salt lakes in the Mljet National Park and enjoy the boat ride to St Mary Isle, where an ancient Benedictine monastery, an old abbey and a Church dating from the 12th century is situated. Return to the vessel for lunch, followed by departure towards Dubrovnik. Late afternoon arrival in Dubrovnik, but before docking at the Gruž harbour, the captain will arrange an evening dinner cruise

alongside the old city walls. Enjoy the spectacular views of this magnificent ancient town. Overnight in Dubrovnik.

Day 4: DUBROVNIK (B)

After breakfast, transfer to the Old Town for a guided walking tour to enjoy this magical town. There will be plenty of opportunities to take great pictures as the cable car takes us from the Old Town to the Sr mountain to enjoy scenic views of the Walls and the Elaphiti Islands. Afternoon at leisure to find idyllic spots for lunch and dinner. Meander through the narrow car-free limestone streets - worn smooth under the soles of centuries of pedestrians, seek out a drink in one of the trendy piazzas or walk the famous 1,940 m long walls and take a stroll along the famous STRADUN - both a street and a square, a promenade inside the city walls. Overnight in Dubrovnik.

Day 5: DUBROVNIK - PELJEŠAC PENINSULA (B, L, D)

Early morning departure towards the Pelješac peninsula, home to Croatia's best-known red wines: Dinga and Postup. Before lunch, a short stop at one of the Elaphiti Islands and afternoon arrival to Pelješac peninsula. Today, move away from the shore inland to explore the rural areas. Afternoon transfer to the village, followed by a visit to a local farm to indulge in a heritage dinner with Croatian delicacies and local dishes made from their own produce. Late transfer back to the vessel. Overnight on Pelješac peninsula.

Day 6: PELJEŠAC - HVAR (B, L)





Morning departure towards Hvar. Lunch on the small Island of Š edro, followed by a swim stop at the Pakleni Islands. Arrival to Hvar in the afternoon. Hvar is the longest Island in the Adriatic and one of the sunniest; known for lavish lavender fields and breath-taking beauty. One can find many historical landmarks in Hvar such as the Renaissance cathedral with its original tower and the oldest community theatre in Europe which was founded in 1612, to name a few. Hike up to the town fort overlooking the harbour to get some lovely scenic views of the vessel and the Pakleni islands. In the evening Hvar offers an abundance of entertainment - many restaurants, bars and cafes are open long into the night. Overnight in Hvar.

Day 7: HVAR - BOL - MILNA or PU IŠ A (B, L, T, CD)

Today's destination is the Island of Bra and the picturesque town of Bol. Walk along the promenade or swim at one of the most famous beaches in Dalmatia - Zlatni Rat (the Golden cape - known for its gravel promontory shifts from side to side as the wind and waves constantly change its shape). Bol is a typical fishermen's town turned into a popular tourist destination. After lunch on board, time at leisure until wine tasting. Departure for Milna or Pu iš a and Captain's farewell dinner with live entertainment on board. Overnight in Milna or Pu iš a.

Day 8: MILNA or PU IŠ A - SPLIT (B)

Early morning departure for Split. Gather for one last breakfast at the vessel, followed by goodbyes with the crew and all the

new friends, before they see you off in Split. Transfer to the Split airport.

Please note, that passengers should not book flights from Split departing before midday.

After lunch on board you will arrive in your destination for the day, and have the afternoon to explore before choosing one of the many great erstaurants and cafes that line the ports we stop in. With a large sun deck with hot tub, air conditioned dining room, outside lounge, rear swim plateform and 20 ensuite cabins, all with air conditioning, there is plenty of space for everyone to relax. MV Admiral is a stunning 43 metre long and 9 metre wide Deluxe vessel. Built in 2015 with latest state-of-the-art equipment and amenities, MV Admiral carries just 39 passengers in 19 twin or double cabins and 1 single cabin, guaranteeing an intimate setting for all guests.
